

CLINICAL SUPERVISION

Course Outline:

This course provides participants with an opportunity to further develop their knowledge of and practice of clinical supervision in the helping professions.

What you will learn:

- The relevance of supervision in human service delivery
- How to offer supervision in a range of contexts using a variety of techniques and methods
- To clarify your own model or approach to supervision
- To identify how theoretical ideas inform your approach to supervision
- How to provide supervision that accounts for contextual issues,
- E.g. work context, wider organisational systems, socio-cultural and political issues

The course is for therapists, counsellors, mediators, psychologists and other health professionals who are looking to develop skills in providing clinical supervision to others in their profession. For those who are already supervisors, the course will provide opportunities to further develop their expertise and their own approach to supervision.
