My Zone My Bus 10 – now available in Western Sydney. 10 trips can be used on public and private buses. No time limit, savings of 20%

My Multi – available for unlimited bus/ferry/train travel for a day (\$20), week (\$57) or month. It is zone based. Maximum amount of money anyone should have to pay for a week's travel is \$ 57 – does not include airport line.

Can be purchased on the internet, newsagents, auto ticketing machines.

Trainee Concessions – eligible for half price tickets. Need to be registered with Department of Education and Training.

Free Campbelltown Shuttle Bus – 12 month trial

Family Fun day Sunday - \$2.50 per person anywhere in Sydney if you have a child with you.

How else we can help? – attend staff meetings; conduct group travel training for young people.
